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## **INTRODUCTORY NOTES**

### **1. Demographic characteristics**

#### ***1.1 Population***

The resident population of the Republic of Mauritius was estimated at 1,280,924 as at 1 July 2010, of whom 649,232 were females (630,103 in the Island of Mauritius and 19,129 in Rodrigues). The percentage of women was 50.7% in the Republic of Mauritius. In 2010, the mean age of women in the Island of Mauritius was 34.8 years against 33.3 for men.

#### ***1.2 Births***

Women gave fewer births in 2010 as compared to 2009. The number of births occurring in the Republic of Mauritius in 2010 was 14831 compared to 15,259 in 2009. The crude birth rate for the Republic of Mauritius was 12.0 for 2009 and 11.7 for 2010 and the total fertility rate which can be calculated as the average number of children born per woman was 1.50 and 1.47 respectively for 2009 and 2010.

#### ***1.3 Deaths***

In 2010, 9,131 deaths were registered in the Republic of Mauritius compared to 9,224 in 2009. Lower mortality was observed for women than for men, with crude death rate being 8.0 for men and 6.2 for women.

Among men, the leading causes of death were diabetes (20.7%) followed by heart disease (18.2%) in 2010. In the case of women, 27.1% deaths were due to diabetes, followed by heart diseases (18.2%).

Diseases specific to women such as 'cancer of female breast', 'cancer of uterus' and 'complications of pregnancy and childbirths' resulted in 4.4% of all deaths among women. On the other hand, 'prostate cancer', which is applicable to men only, was the cause of 1.4% of all male deaths.



### ***1.4 Marriages***

In the Republic of Mauritius, the number of registered marriages decreased from 10,619 in 2009 to 10,555 in 2010. In the Island of Mauritius it decreased from 10,446 in 2009 to 10,370 in 2010 whereas in Rodrigues it increased from 173 to 185 for the same periods. For the Republic of Mauritius, the crude marriage rate, defined as the number of persons getting married per 1,000 mid-year population, stood at 16.7 and 16.5 for 2009 and 2010 respectively.

### ***1.5 Divorces***

Divorces at the same time, decreased from 2,154 in 2009 to 1,837 in 2010 for the Republic of Mauritius.

### ***1.6 Marital status***

2000 Population Census data on marital status for the Republic of Mauritius revealed that the proportion of single (never married) persons was higher among males than females. About 36% of males were single against 23% for females, mainly because women tend to get married at an earlier age than men.

Widowhood was found to be higher among women than among men as a result of a higher life expectancy among women. About 13% of women were widowed against 2% for men.

The proportion of married was about 60% among both men and women.

### ***1.7 Life expectancy***

There has been a general improvement in life expectancy over the years though improvement was more pronounced among females. This has led to a general increase in the gap in life expectancy at birth between males and females, from 4.9 in 1972 to 7.3 in 1983, 7.8 in 1990 and then to 7.1 in 2000. The life expectancy at birth for 2010 in the Republic of Mauritius was 76.8 years for women compared to 69.6 years for men.

## **2. Education**

Both 1990 and 2000 Population Censuses data reveal that the overall educational attainment for women in the Republic of Mauritius is lower than that for men. Among those aged 15 years and above, 79.4% of women had attained primary education or higher against 91.4% among men in 1990, whilst in 2000, the corresponding figures were 86.4% and 94.7% respectively.

The primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius was 117,432 in 2010 compared to 117,922 in 2009 (Table 4.4). Boys represented 51% of the 2010 primary school population and girls 49%. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (primary enrolment as a percentage of the population aged 6 to 11 years) was 100 % for boys and 101% for girls.

However, at secondary level, the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) is higher for girls than for boys. The 2010 Gross Enrolment Ratio was 72% for girls against 65% for boys.

Regarding overall performance in examinations, it is observed that girls do better than boys. In 2010, the pass rates for the Certificate of Primary Education (CPE) was 74.4% for girls as compared to 63.1% for boys. For the School Certificate (SC) examinations, girls recorded a higher pass rate, 81.0% against 73.3%. The pass rate for girls at the Higher School Certificate (HSC) was 81.8% against 73.9% for boys.

## **3. Activity status**

Statistics show that women are less economically active compared to men. In 2010, 44% of women aged 16 years and above were active against 76% among men of the same age.

In 2010, around 38% of working women were either employed as plant and machine operators or engaged in elementary occupations. About one fifth of them were service and sales workers.

Among employed women, 26% drew a salary of up to Rs 4,000 compared to 7% among employed men. The average monthly income in 2010 was lower for women than for men, Rs 10,500 against Rs 15,700.

In 2010, women comprised about 31% of the persons employed in the Government services (Central and Local Government). About 67% of those employed in various ministries were technicians, associate professionals and clerks.

#### **4. Persons with disabilities**

Up to date figures on persons with disabilities are obtained from statistics of beneficiaries of invalidity pension. These persons should however be certified by the medical board to be either permanently or substantially incapacitated to work to a degree of at least 60% for a period of at least 12 months. In the Republic of Mauritius, the number of such persons as at June 2010 was 44,497 (19,649 men, 24,848 women).

#### **5. Domestic Violence and Child Abuse**

The total number of cases (new and follow up) registered at the Family Support Bureaux has increased by 9.2% from 20,635 in 2009 to 22,337 in 2010

The main cause of family problems identified in new adult cases reported in 2010 was verbal assault followed by physical assault, alcoholism, extra marital affairs and interference of in-laws.

The total number of cases reported at the Child Development Unit of the Family Support Bureaux increased from 4,909 in 2009 to 6,021 in 2010.

#### **6. Children**

##### ***6.1 Child population***

In 2010, 26.6 % of the population in the Republic of Mauritius were less than 18 years compared to 27.3% in 2009. The corresponding figures for the Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues for 2010 were 26.3% and 36.5% respectively.

##### ***6.2 Juvenile offences***

The number of juveniles involved in offences in the Republic of Mauritius decreased from 765 in 2009 to 648 in 2010. The juvenile delinquency rate thus decreased from 6.0 in 2009 to 5.2 in 2010 .

In 2010, the juvenile delinquency rate for the Island of Mauritius was 5.3 and that for Rodrigues 3.1.

In the Republic of Mauritius in 2010, the most common juvenile offence was assault (43.1%) followed by larceny (24.7%).

##### ***6.3 Orphans***

At June 2010, the number of beneficiaries of Basic Orphan's pension aged under 19 years in the Republic of Mauritius totalled 349, among which 161 were females and 188 males.

## CONCEPTS & DEFINITIONS

1. Median age : The age which divides the population into two equal-size groups, one of which is younger and the other older than the median.
2. Crude birth rate : The number of live births registered in a year per 1,000 mid-year population.
3. General fertility rate : The number of live births occurring in a year per 1,000 women aged (15 - 49) years at mid-year.
4. Total fertility rate : The average number of children born to an average woman assuming that she survives to the end of her child-bearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of age-specific fertility rates.
5. Gross reproduction rate : The average number of daughters born to an average woman assuming that she survives to the end of her child-bearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of age-specific fertility rates.
6. Net reproduction rate : The extent to which an average woman will replace herself assuming a fixed schedule of age-specific mortality and fertility rates to prevail through her reproductive span of life.
7. Crude death rate : The number of deaths in a year per 1,000 mid-year population.
8. Infant death : Death of an infant aged under one year.
9. Infant mortality rate : The number of infant deaths in a year per 1,000 live-births during the year.
10. Under 5 mortality rate : The number of deaths of children aged under 5 years in a year per 1,000 live-births during the year.
11. Still birth : A child born after the twenty-eighth week of pregnancy and not breathing or showing any signs of life at any time after being completely expelled from the mother.
12. Maternal mortality rate : The number of deaths due to pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperium per 1,000 live births during that year.
13. Marriage rate : The number of persons married in a year per 1,000 mid-year population.
14. Divorce rate : The number of persons divorced in a year per 1,000 mid-year population.
15. Enrolment rate
  - (i) Primary : The number of students (including students of less than 6 years or greater than 11 years) enrolled per 100 population aged (6 – 11) years.
  - (ii) Secondary : The number of students enrolled per 100 population aged (12 – 19) years.

16. Economically active population : The economically active population is made up of the employed and the unemployed populations. The employed population consists of persons, who are working while the unemployed population consists of persons who are *not working* but who are *looking for work and are available for work*.
17. Not economically active population : The inactive population is neither employed nor unemployed and consists mainly of students, homemakers, retired persons and the disabled.
18. Government Services : Total Government services include both Central and Local Governments but exclude Extra Budgetary Units (EBUs).

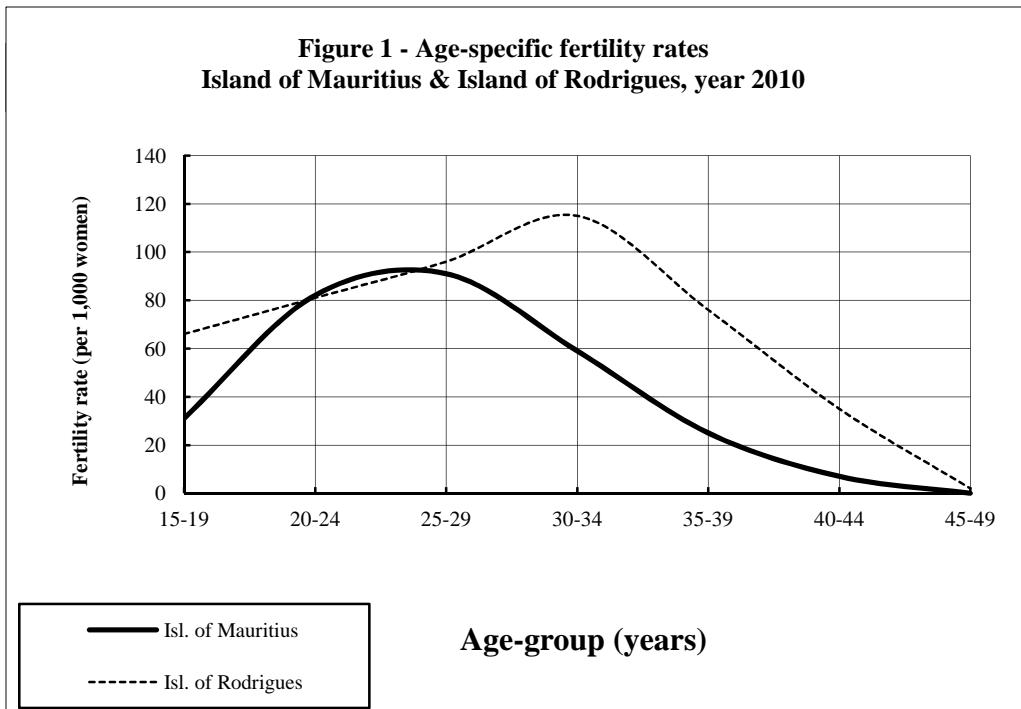
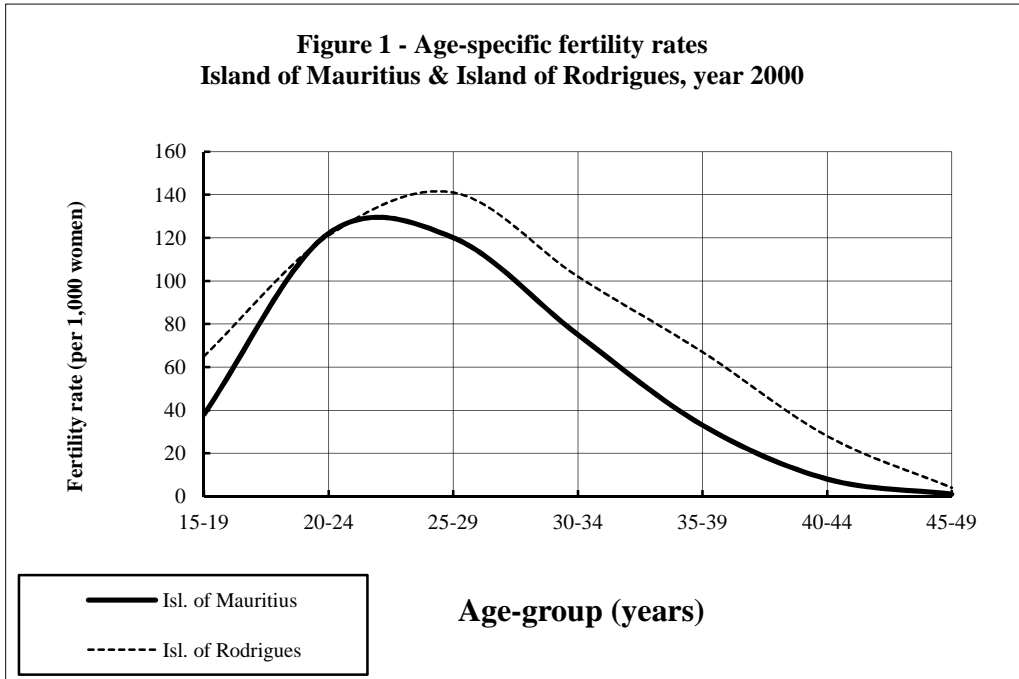

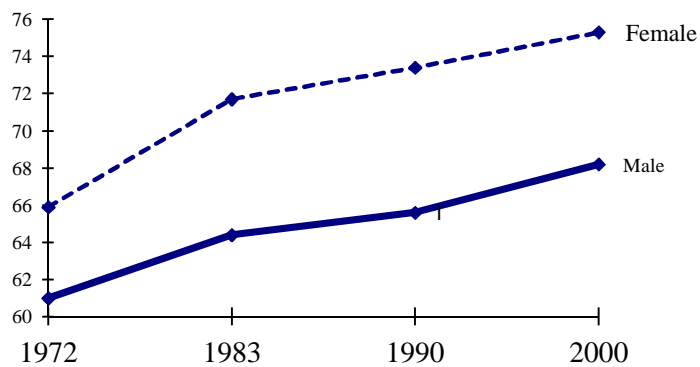

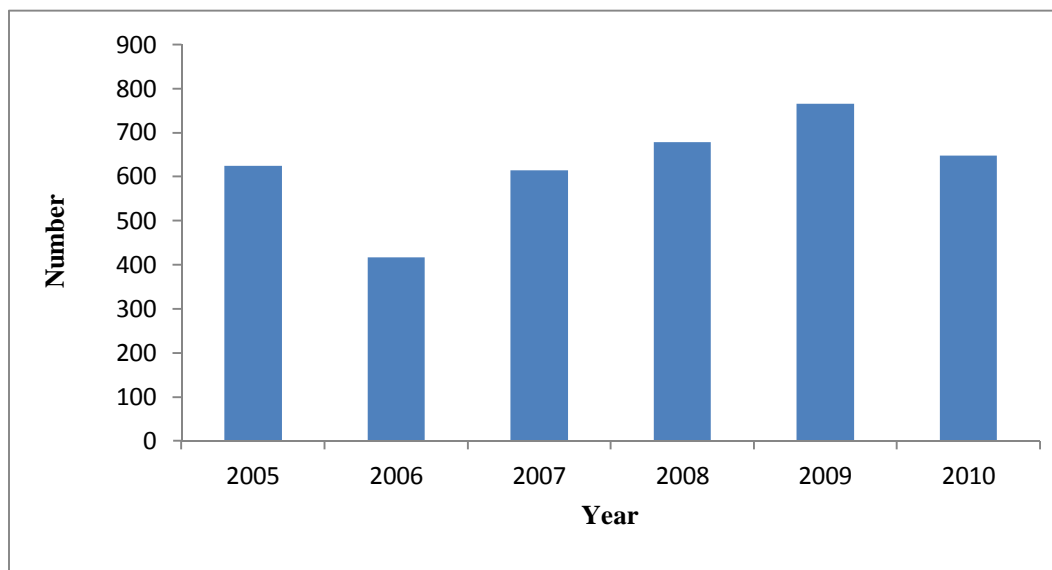

Netherlands ranked first with a value of 0.17 and Yemen last with a value of 0.85.
