INTRODUCTORY NOTES

1. Demographic characteristics

1.1 Population

The resident population of the Republic of Mauritius was estimated at 1,263,820 as at 31st December 2016, of whom 638,462 were females (616,798 in the Island of Mauritius, 21,564 in the Island of Rodrigues and 100 in Agalega & St Brandon). The percentage of women was 50.5% in the Republic of Mauritius in both 2015 and 2016. In 2016, the mean age of women for the Republic of Mauritius was 37.3 years against 35.7 for men.

1.2 Births

Women gave more births in 2016 as compared to 2015. The number of births occurring in the Republic of Mauritius in 2016 was 12,948 (6,597 male and 6,351 female) compared to 12,640 (6,557 male and 6,083 female) in 2015 corresponding to a crude birth rate of 10.4 per 1000 mid-year population compared to 10.1 in 2015. The total fertility rate which can be calculated as the average number of children born per woman was 1.36 and 1.40 respectively for 2015 and 2016.

1.3 Infant and Maternal Mortality Rate

The number of infant deaths, that is deaths among children aged under one year, registered in 2016 was 154, corresponding to an infant mortality rate 11.8 per thousand live births compared to 13.6 (173 infants deaths) in 2015.

In 2016, the number of maternal deaths registered was 6 same as in 2015. The maternal mortality rate per 1,000 live-births dropped from 0.47 in 2015 to 0.46 in 2016.

1.4 Deaths

In the Republic of Mauritius, the registered number of deaths for 2016 was at 10,174 (5,589 male and 4,585 female) compared to 9,747 (5,444 male and 4,303 female) in 2015 giving a corresponding crude death rate of 8.1 per 1,000 mid-year population compared to 7.7 in 2015. Lower mortality was observed in 2016 for women compared to men, with crude death rate being 8.9 for men and 7.2 for women.

The major cause of death among men and women in 2016 was diabetes, heart diseases and cerebrovascular diseases. Diabetes accounted for 1,102 (24.0%) deaths among women and 1,261 (22.6%) deaths among men. Heart diseases and cerebrovascular accounted for 924 (20.1%) and 491 (10.7%) deaths among women and 1,071 (19.2%) and 542 (9.7%) deaths among men.

Diseases specific to women, such as breast cancer, cervical cancer, cancer of uterus including cervix uteri and 'complications of pregnancy and childbirths', resulted in 255 (5.5%) deaths among women. On the other hand, 'prostate cancer', which is applicable to men only, was the cause of 60 (1.1%) deaths among men.

1.5 Marriages

In the Republic of Mauritius, the number of registered marriages increased from 9,709 in 2015 to 10,042 in 2016, giving a crude marriage rate, defined as the number of persons getting married per 1,000 mid-year population of 15.9 against 15.4 in 2015. In the Island of

Mauritius it increased from 9,548 in 2015 to 9,882 in 2016, giving a crude marriage rate of 16.2, against 15.6 in 2015 and in the Island of Rodrigues it decreased from 161 to 160 for the same period giving a crude marriage rate of 7.6 compared to 7.7 in 2015.

1.6 Divorces

There were 1,910 divorces registered for the Republic of Mauritius in 2016, showing a decrease of 251 as compared to 2015 (2,161). The crude divorce rate decreased from 3.4 persons divorced per 1,000 mid-year population in 2015 to 3.0 in 2016.

1.7 Marital status

The 2011 population Census data for the Republic of Mauritius revealed that, out of the 981,085 persons aged 15 years or more, 578,326 (58.9%) were married or living with a partner. On the other hand, 271,144 (27.6%) persons were single. The number of widowed and divorced/separated was 79,975 (8.1%) and 41,026 (4.2%) respectively.

The proportion of single (never married) persons was higher among males than females. About 33.2% of males were single against 22.3% for females, mainly because women tend to get married at an earlier age than men.

Widowhood was found to be higher among women than among men as a result of a higher life expectancy among women. There were 69,392 (13.9%) women who were widowed against 10,583 (2.2%) men.

The proportion of married was about 60.0% among men and 57.9% among women.

1.8 Life expectancy

There has been a general improvement in life expectancy over the years though improvement was more pronounced among males. This has led to a decrease in the gap in life expectancy at birth between males and females from 7.1 in 2011 to 6.6 in 2016. The life expectancy at birth for 2015 in the Republic of Mauritius was 77.8 years for women compared to 71.2 years for men. Life expectancy among males as well as that among females increased to reach 71.3 years and 77.9 years respectively in 2016.

2. Education

In 2000 and 2011 Population Censuses data revealed that though the overall educational attainment is higher among male population, there are no marked differences between men and women at the different levels. Among those aged 15 years and above, 86.4% of women had attained primary education or higher against 94.7% among men in 2000, whilst in 2011, the corresponding figures were 92% and 97.4% respectively. It is, however, worth noted that nearly 8% of the female population have not been to school or reached only the preprimary level against 3% for the male population. 3.9% of women held a university degree compared to 5.6% for men.

The pre-primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius was 28,866 in 2016 compared to 29,832 in 2015. Boys represented 50.6% of the 2016 pre-primary school population and girls 49.4%. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (pre-primary enrolment as a percentage of the population aged 4 to 5 years) was 100 % for boys, same as for girls.

The primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius was 97,300 in 2016 compared to 101,422 in 2015. Boys represented 50.5% of the 2016 primary school population and

girls 49.5%. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (primary enrolment as a percentage of the population aged 6 to 11 years) was 96 % for boys and 97% for girls.

However, at secondary level (academic), the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) was higher for girls than for boys. The 2016 Gross Enrolment Ratio was 77% for girls against 68% for boys.

Regarding overall performance in examinations, it was observed that girls were more successful than boys. In 2016, the pass rate among school candidates who took part in the Certificate of Primary Education (CPE) examination was 80.3% for girls as compared to 69.4% for boys. For the School Certificate (SC) examinations, girls recorded a higher pass rate, 75.0% against 68.5%. The pass rate for girls at the Higher School Certificate (HSC) was 78.7% against 70.9% for boys.

3. Economic Characteristics

As in previous years statistics indicate that women are still less economically active than men. In 2016, 45.5% of women aged 16 years and above were actively participating in the economy against 74.3% among men of the same age group. The corresponding percentages for 2015 were 46.6% and 74.8% respectively.

In 2016, nearly 25% of working men were in craft and related trades. Around 22% were either employed as plant and machine operators or engaged in elementary occupations. About 19% of them were service and sales workers. As regards to working women, nearly 25% of them were service and sales workers and around 22% were engaged in elementary occupation.

Among employed women, 30.6% drew an average salary of up to Rs 6,000 compared to 12.2% among employed male. Only 46.1% of employed women received a salary above Rs 10,000 while the percentage stood at 70.1% for their male counterparts. The mean income was lower for women than for men – Rs 15,600 against Rs 21,700 monthly in 2016.

In 2016, women comprised around 35.3% of the persons employed in the Government services (Central and Local Government). About 65.5% of those employed in various Ministries were technicians, associate professionals and clerks.

4. Persons receiving pensions and with disabilities

Basic Retirement Pension, also known as old-age pension, is payable to every Mauritian citizen aged 60 years and above, subject to certain residency conditions. The number of old-age pensioners, which stood at 188,470 as at June 2015 increased by 4.5% to reach 197,037 as at June 2016. The proportion of old-age female pensioners was 55.8% in 2016.

Basic Widow's Pension is payable to widows aged 16 to 59 years who were civilly and/or religiously married to their late husband. The number of beneficiaries of Widow's pension decreased by 2.0%, from 20,291 as at June 2015 to 19,890 as at June 2016.

The Basic Invalid's Pension is payable to any person aged 15 to 59 years if certified by Medical Board that the person is either permanently or substantially incapacitated to work to a degree of 60% or more for at least 12 months. The number of such beneficiaries decreased from 30,412 as at June 2015 to 29,287 as at June 2016, showing a decrease of 3.7%.

Social Aid is an income-tested scheme. It is payable to the head of a family who is incapable of earning his living adequately and who has insufficient means to support himself and his dependents. The total number of families benefiting from such assistance decreased by 0.2% from 20,369 in June 2015 to 20,319 in June 2016.

Figures on persons with disabilities are obtained from statistics of beneficiaries of invalidity pension. The number of such persons was 45,297 (of whom 20,491 were men and 24,806 were women) as at June 2016.

5. Domestic Violence and Child Abuse

The total number of cases registered at the Family Support Bureau was 5,157 in 2016, among which 2,709 cases were domestic violence.

In 2016, 1,852 (89.2%) new female cases of domestic violence were reported at the Ministry of Gender Equality, Child Development and Family Welfare. One out of every 10 cases of domestic violence was against men.

The main cause behind domestic violence identified in new adult cases reported in 2016 were physical assault by spouse/partner, verbal assault by partner, threatening assault by spouse and harassment by spouse.

The total number of cases of child abuse reported at the Family Support Bureau decreased by 2.2% from 6,035 (54.7% for female) in 2015 to 5,904 (53.6% for female) in 2016.

6. Children

6.1 Child population

In 2016, 23.7 % of the population in the Republic of Mauritius was less than 18 years. The corresponding percentages for the Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues for 2016 were 23.4 and 32.8 respectively.

6.2 Juvenile offences

From 2015 to 2016, the number juvenile offenders (excluding contraveners) involved in crime and misdemeanors increased by 3.6% from 717 to 743, of whom 233 (31.4%) in assaults, 179 (24.1%) in larceny and 99 (13.3%) in sexual offences. The juvenile delinquency rate (excluding contraventions) rose to 6.4 per 1,000 juvenile population from 6.1 in 2015 for Republic of Mauritius.

In 2016, the juvenile delinquency rate for the Island of Mauritius was 6.0 and that for Rodrigues 14.0.

6.3 Orphans

Basic Orphan's Pension (BOP) is payable to all orphans under the age of 15, or under 20 years, if they are in full-time education. As at June 2016, the number of beneficiaries of BOP in the Republic of Mauritius totaled 370, among whom 190 were females and 180 males.

In 2016, the total number of children benefitting from Child's allowance was 15,368 (7,968 males and 7,400 females).

6.4 Children deprived of family environment

The number of children separated from their families and admitted in institutions decreased from 186 in 2015 to 126 in 2016.

Eleven children were placed in foster families in 2016 as compared to eight in 2015.

7. Training organized by the Home Economics Unit of Ministry of Gender Equality, Child Development and Family Welfare

7.1 Persons following training courses

The number of persons following training courses conducted by the Home Economics Unit of Ministry of Gender Equality, Child Development and Family Welfare was 3,662 in 2016. In 2016, 3,634 women and 28 men attended the courses compared to 3,290 women and 16 men in 2015.

8. Gender Gap Index (GGI)

8.1 Gender Gap Index

The Global Gender Gap Index (GGI) seeks to measure one important aspect of gender equality; their relative gaps between women and men across a large set of countries and across four key areas: economic participation and opportunity, educational attainment, health and survival and political empowerment. The equality benchmark is considered to be one with no gap between men and women.

Mauritius holds the 113th position overall out of 144 countries in 2016, improving from the 120th position held in 2015.

17. Economically active population/Labour Force

: The economically active or Labour Force population is made up of the employed and the unemployed populations.

18. Employment

: Employed population consists of Mauritians aged 16 years and above (16+) who have worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week of a month. It includes those who are temporarily absent from work for reasons such as leave with pay, leave without pay and temporary disorganisation of work (bad weather, break down of equipment, lack of order, etc.)

19. Unemployment

: Unemployed population comprises all Mauritians aged 16+ who are not working but who are looking for work and are available for work during the reference period.

20. Unemployment rate

: Unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force

21. Inactive population

: The inactive population is neither employed nor unemployed and consists of all Mauritians aged 16+, not forming part of the Labour force for reasons such as attendance at educational institutions, engagement in household duties, retirement, old age and infirmity/disablement.

22. Government Services

: Total Government services include both Central and Local governents but exclude Extra Budgetary Units (EBUs)





Figure 2 : Life expectancy at birth by sex, at each census, Republic of Mauritius




